NO PARKING ZONES AROUND SCHOOLS

Parents are asked to respect the marked zones around the school in regard to parking. If the parks are outlined in white, it is acceptable to park however if an area is outlined in YELLOW this indicates a **No Stopping** zone and is for buses or delivery vehicles only.

The main area in front of the school gate is marked in yellow and therefore a no parking zone for vehicles. The police will randomly patrol this area and you will incur a fine if found parked in this zone.

NAPLAN 2017 - MAY 9TH ONWARD

Sunset State School remains a pilot school for conducting NAPLAN online. The Queensland Government has provided a helpful website with information for parents. Grades 3 and 5 will be sitting their online tests from 8.30am Tuesday 9th May in the library area. They will be tested in:

- Writing a story (narrative) or a text to persuade.
- Spelling, grammar and punctuation.
- Reading and understanding what has been read (comprehension)
- Numeracy which is using number and other mathematical skills to problem solve in real world situations.

The testing will continue over the week.

Coming to school every day from **Prep** onward means students can be taught essential skills and become experts in learning to learn.

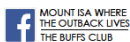
